



CTED holds consistent, transparent and even-handed dialogue with Member States


- CTED helps translate Security requirements Council into specific legal and operational measures that facilitate the implementation of those requirements by Member States.
- CTED hosts the UN's largest counter-terrorism database, which reflects counter-terrorism measures introduced by Member States.
- This data has enabled CTED to complete the desk-based assessments of all 193 UN Member Global continue produce States, to implementation surveys and analytical reports, prioritize key recommendations in and response to the rapidly evolving threats.
