1. The situation concerning Western Sahara

During the period under review, the Security Council held four meetings, including two closed meetings, and adopted two resolutions in connection with the situation concerning Western Sahara. By resolutions 2152 (2014) and 2218 (2015), the Council extended the mandate of the United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara (MINURSO)² for a period of one year each time.

2. The situation in Liberia

During the period under review, the Security Council held 14 meetings in connection with the situation in Liberia, including three closed meetings with troop- and police-contributing countries, and adopted six resolutions, all under Chapter VII of the Charter. The Council, inter alia, heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Mission in Liberia (UNMIL), the Chair of the Liberia configuration of the Peacebuilding Commission and the Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations.

During the period under review, the Council extended the mandate of UNMIL³ for periods of three months, nine months and one year, respectively.⁴ By resolution 2215 (2015), the Council authorized the

resumption of the drawdown of UNMIL, which had been suspended since September 2014 owing to the Ebola virus disease outbreak, and reaffirmed its expectation that the Government of Liberia would assume fully its complete security responsibilities from UNMIL no later than 30 June 2016. By resolution 2237 (2015), the Council decided to terminate the travel and financial measures imposed by resolutions 1521 (2003) and 1532 (2004), respectively. During the period under review, the mandate of the Panel of Experts was twice extended for 10 months.⁵
