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INTRODUCTION

The Economic and Social Council, under the authority of the General Assembly, is the United Nations organ which co-ordinates the economic and social work of the United Nations and its system of organizations. The Council has fifty-four members and generally holds the following sessions each year: a short organizational session in New York in January, the first regular session in New York in May, the second regular session in Geneva in July. Throughout the year there are meetings of the Council's committees, commissions and other subsidiary bodies.

The Index to Proceedings of the Economic and Social Council is an annual bibliographic guide to the proceedings and documentation of the Economic and Social Council. This issue covers the year 1989, which includes the documentation of the organizational, first regular and second regular sessions and of the sessional or ad hoc committees or other bodies that met during these sessions. The Index is prepared by the Dag Hammarskjöld Library as one of the products of the United Nations Bibliographic Information System (UNBIS).

ARRANGEMENT OF THE INDEX

The Index consists of three sections.

The first section contains information relating to organizational matters:

Sessional information, listing Member States and their terms of office as well as the officers of the Council and providing information on rules of procedure and resolutions and decisions.

Subsidiary bodies and organs and programmes related to the Economic and Social Council to which members were elected or appointed during the 1989 sessions of the Council, listing the members and terms of office.

The second section consists of three parts, one for each session which met during the year. Each part is subdivided as follows:

Check-list of meetings, listing the meetings of the Economic and Social Council and its sessional committees;

Agenda, listing matters considered by and brought before the Council and the subject headings under which these items appear in the Subject Index;

Subject Index, providing topical access to Economic and Social Council documentation arranged alphabetically by subject and listing documents considered under each item, meetings at which the items were considered and the action taken by the Council;

Index to speeches, providing access to speeches that were made before the Council. The Index is divided into three sections: corporate names/countries, speakers and subjects.

The third section contains consolidated information relating to resolutions, documents and reports:

List of resolutions, listing resolutions adopted by the Council and indicating for each session the resolution number, the subject and the meeting and date when the resolution was adopted;

List of documents, listing documents issued for the year 1989 and providing information on the republication of provisional documents in printed Official Records;

Reports of the sessional committees, listing, by subject, the reports on the items discussed in the committees.

SERIES SYMBOLS

In 1978 certain modifications were introduced in the citation and series symbols of the documents of the Economic and Social Council and its sessional committees. They are as follows:

(a) The sessions of the Council are formally identified as the organizational, first regular and second regular sessions of a particular calendar year, as prescribed in rule 1 of the rules of procedure of the Council;

(b) Special sessions, including subject-oriented sessions, are numbered consecutively within each year, and are identified as the first special session (year), second special session (year), etc.;

(c) The sessional committees of the Council are designated as First Committee (formerly Economic Committee), Second Committee (formerly Social Committee) and Third Committee (formerly Policy and Programme Co-ordination Committee);

(d) Ad hoc sessional committees may be established as required and are described as ad hoc sessional committees on particular subjects;

(e) Resolutions and decisions are numbered on a yearly basis. Resolutions begin each year with 1, decisions start with 100. They are identified as resolution 1989/1, decision 1989/101, etc.;

(f) Supplements to the Official Records are numbered consecutively, with Supplements No. 1, IA and IB containing the resolutions and decisions adopted during the year.

Symbols of documents of the Council and its sessional and ad hoc committees or other bodies consist of combinations as appropriate, of the following elements:

(a) The parent body (i.e. the Economic and Social Council): E/- ;

(b) The year of consideration;

(c) Sessional and ad hoc committees or other bodies: C.1, C.2, AC.1, AC.2, WG.1, WG.2, etc.

DOCUMENTATION OF THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL

Summary records of plenary meetings of the Economic and Social Council are first issued in provisional form for limited distribution. They are later combined in corrected form in a single printed volume of Official Records for the year.

In accordance with decision 1987/179, the Council decided, for a period of two years, to discontinue the issuing of summary records for its sessional committees: First (Economic) Committee, Second (Social) Committee and Third (Programme and Co-ordination) Committee. Meeting records are, however, provided for the Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (E/C.12/1989/SR.1-25). These summary records are issued for general distribution, with any corrections to be consolidated in a single corrigendum.

All summary records may be identified by their symbol, which consists of the series symbol followed by SR, and then a number which corresponds to the number of the meeting. The fifth plenary meeting, for example, is cited as E/1989/SR.5 while the records of the tenth meeting of the Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights is cited as E/C.12/1989/SR.10.

Some documents may later be printed as Supplements to the Official Records (and are so indicated in this Index); others are issued only in provisional form.

CRIME PREVENTION (AGENDA ITEM 11) (cont.)

Implementation of the safeguards guaranteeing protection of the rights of those facing the death penalty.

Effective prevention and investigation of extra-legal, arbitrary and summary executions.

Recommends that the Principles on the Effective Prevention and Investigation of Extra-legal, Arbitrary and Summary Executions annexed to the resolution shall be taken into account and respected by Governments within the framework of their national legislation and practices, and shall be brought to the attention of law enforcement and criminal justice officials, military personnel, lawyers, members of the executive and legislative bodies of the Government and the public in general; requests the Committee on Crime Prevention and Control to keep the recommendations under constant review, including implementation of the Principles; invites Member States to ratify or accede to international instruments that prohibit extra-legal, arbitrary and summary executions; requests the Secretary-General to include the Principles in the UN publication entitled "Human Rights: A Compilation of International Instruments"; requests the UN regional and interregional institutes for the prevention of crime and the treatment of offenders to give special attention in their research and training programmes to the Principles, and to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, the provisions of the Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment, the Code of Conduct for Law Enforcement Officials, the Declaration of Basic Principles of Justice for Victims of Crime and Abuse of Power and other international instruments relevant to the question of extra-legal, arbitrary and summary executions (adopted without vote, 15th meeting, 24 May 1989).

[E/RES/]1989/15 (E/1989/INF/7) Demand and supply of opiates for medical and scientific purposes.

Urges all Governments to give serious consideration to ways of resolving the problem of excess stocks and bringing about rapid improvement; commends the INCB for its efforts and requests it to pursue the early finalization and implementation of the project referred to in its report, which would assess legitimate needs for opiates in various regions of the world hitherto unmet because of insufficient health care, difficult economic situations or other conditions; requests the Secretary-General to transmit the resolution to all Governments and appropriate international agencies for consideration and implementation (adopted without vote, 12th meeting, 22 May 1989).

[E/RES/]1989/16 (E/1989/INF/7)

Contribution of the UN Fund for Drug Abuse Control to the fight against illicit traffic in and abuse of drugs.

Urges the UN Fund for Drug Abuse Control to continue to develop programmes that will address the multifaceted drug problem, using, as guiding tools, the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs of 1961, as amended by the 1972 Protocol, the Convention on Psychotropic Substances of 1971 and the UN Convention against Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances; affirms that the UN Convention shall not derogate from earlier treaty rights and obligations; encourages the INCB, the Division of Narcotic Drugs and the UN Fund for Drug Abuse Control to continue to strengthen their co-operation and take whatever measures may be necessary to achieve the aims of the international conventions in accordance with the advice and suggestions of the Commission on Narcotic Drugs and in accordance with the policy directives received from the UN legislative bodies; expresses its appreciation to the Secretary-General and the Executive Director of the UN Fund for Drug Abuse Control for the initiative and leadership that have characterized the development of the Fund; urges Governments to consider continuing and increasing substantially their voluntary contributions to the Fund (adopted without vote, 12th meeting, 22 May 1989).

[E/RES/]1989/17 (E/1989/INF/7) Special session of the Commission on Narcotic Drugs.

Decides that the Commission shall hold a special session of 5 working days in 1990 at a time when it will not overlap with other meetings and within existing UN resources, for the following purposes: (a) to consider urgently further measures that may be required to facilitate the entry into force of the 1988 UN Convention against Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances or, if the Convention has entered into force in the interim, the measures required to ensure implementation of its provisions; (b) to consider urgent questions relating to the possible scheduling of substances under the provisions of the international drug control treaties, following receipt of recommendations to that effect from WHO; (c) to consider appropriate action to improve regional co-operation in drug law enforcement; (d) to consider the report of the INCB for 1989, an interim report from the UN Fund for Drug Abuse Control and other relevant matters requiring urgent attention (adopted without vote, 12th meeting, 22 May 1989).

Allocation of appropriate resources and priority to the international drug control programme.

Development of energy resources and efficient use of energy production and utilization of infrastructures.

Decides that the Committee on Natural Resources at its 12th session shall give priority consideration to energy resources, emphasizing the need to intensify technical co-operation programmes aimed at the exploration, development and efficient utilization of the energy resources of the developing countries, and requests the Secretary-General to submit to the Committee at that session a reply on the question of technical co-operation programmes in energy resources; affirms the need for the UN system to promote the international exchange of experience and knowledge and the flow of efficient technologies, especially new and emerging ones, particularly to developing countries, for use in the exploration and exploitation of energy resources, and to actively pursue the establishment of computer-based national information systems on energy technologies and projects, as well as other information for energy policy analysis and energy sector management; requests the Secretary-General to submit to the Committee on Natural Resources at its 12th session a report on trends and salient issues in energy, including the potential of development and utilization of the natural gas, heavy crude, tar sand, oil shale and geothermal resources available in the developing countries, including prospects for subregional, regional and interregional co-operation in that area, and to submit a report on energy-saving strategies and measures to improve the efficient utilization of the electricity system (adopted without vote, 12th meeting, 22 May 1989).

Urges the South African régime to accord prisoner-of-war status to captured freedom fighters and to accord all political prisoners sentenced to death, among whom are women, a fair trial based on international legal standards, and to stop the execution of political prisoners; demands the immediate and unconditional release of all political prisoners and detainees; calls upon Governments to impose comprehensive sanctions; appeals to all countries to support educational, health and social welfare programmes for women and children under apartheid; appeals to the international community for increased assistance for women and children refugees in southern Africa and urges it to look into the newly developing situation of refugees and displaced persons, with a view to providing material assistance for them; urges Member States and UN bodies to give effect forthwith to the Forward-looking Strategies that deal with women and children under apartheid, giving particular attention to education, health, vocational training, employment opportunities and the strengthening of the women's sections of liberation movements; requests the Commission on the Status of Women to work closely with women in liberation movements in order to disseminate information and ensure a proper assessment of the needs and aspirations of women and children living under apartheid (adopted 44-2-8, 15th meeting, 24 May 1989).

[E/RES/]1989/34 (E/1989/INF/7)
Situation of Palestinian women.
Requests the Secretary-General to prepare a comprehensive report on the situation of Palestinian women for submission to the Commission on the Status of Women at its 34th session; requests the specialized agencies, in sending missions to the occupied Palestinian territories, to include an expert on women's issues to assess the situation of the Palestinian women and to elaborate specific projects of assistance; strongly condemns the continuation of the "iron-fist" policy by Israel, against Palestinian women and their families in the occupied Palestinian territories; requests the Secretary-General to send a mission composed of experts on the status of women to investigate the condition of Palestinian women and children; requests the Commission on the Status of Women to monitor the implementation of the Nairobi Forward-looking Strategies for the Advancement of Women concerning assistance to Palestinian women inside and outside the occupied territories; reaffirms that Palestinian women cannot fully participate in the attainment of the objectives of the Forward-looking Strategies without the realization of their inalienable right to return to their homes, their right to self-determination and their right to establish an independent State (adopted 38-O-15, 15th meeting, 24 May 1989).

WOMEN'S ADVANCEMENT (AGENDA ITEM 10B) (cont.)

[E/RES/]1989/35 (E/1989/INF/7) Women and peace in Central America.
Calls upon the Presidents of Central American countries to continue their joint efforts to achieve peace in Central America in order to ensure conditions favourable for the attainment of the objectives of the Nairobi Forward-looking Strategies for the Advancement of Women and requests the international community to support these efforts, fully respecting the principles of self-determination of peoples and non-intervention; urges the international community to ensure that programmes of technical, economic and financial co-operation for the region take account of the particular needs and interests of women in Central America; recommends to the Secretary-General that the special plan of co-operation for Central America include specific activities supporting the advancement of women in the region; exhorts the Governments of Central American countries and of the countries of the Contadora Group and its Support Group to encourage and ensure the full participation of women at all levels in the search for peace, pluralism, democracy and overall development in the region; urges national and international, governmental and non-governmental women's organizations to participate in and support actively the processes of democratization, peace and development in Central America (adopted without vote, 15th meeting, 24 May 1989).

[E/RES/]1989/36 (E/1989/INF/7) Equality in economic and social participation.
Urges Governments to give high priority to measures and temporary affirmative action programmes that will more rapidly bring about equality in women's economic participation, in particular to programmes that will ensure: (a) women's access to the labour market and to education and training; (b) elimination of sex segregation in the labour market and in education; (c) women's participation in trade unions; (d) equal pay for equal work; (e) equal access to economic resources, including credit and membership in co-operatives; (f) improved conditions in the informal sector including the application of labour standards, and the development or improvement of sex-disaggregated statistics that accurately reflect women's work in the informal economic sector; urges Governments to ratify the conventions of the ILO on equal pay and working conditions; requests the Commission on the Status of Women at its 34th session to consider measures to accelerate the pace of achieving equality in economic and social participation, including the definition and compilation of bench-mark statistical indicators that could be used for national, regional and international reporting as well as affirmative action programmes; requests the Secretary-General to present to the Commission examples of affirmative action programmes that would be effective for the achievement of equality in economic and social participation; also requests the Secretary-General to submit to the Commission on the Status of Women proposals for the definition and compilation of bench-mark statistical indicators of equality in economic and social participation (adopted without vote, 15th meeting, 24 May 1989).

[E/RES/]1989/37 (E/1989/INF/7)

Measures to facilitate the participation of women in development.

Invites Governments to give high priority to programmes to promote the participation of women in education; urges Governments to meet the relevant provisions of the conventions of ILO, ensuring women's awareness of their rights in all sectors of the economy; invites Governments to achieve the goals of WHO of health for all through primary health care, ensuring that these services and related information reach women and involve them in their design and decision-making; recommends the establishment of programmes of social support for working women; invites Governments to design adequate policies to reduce the need for caring for disabled persons by providing them with opportunities to develop their potential and contribute to society and family; recommends that Unesco and other organizations give higher priority to women in programmes and campaigns intended to eliminate illiteracy; recommends that ILO undertake campaigns to disseminate the conventions approved by Governments and promote the role of labour unions and employers in providing social support to working women; requests the Secretary-General to promote and support the establishment of strong national organizations of disabled persons and provide assistance in the formation of networks of disabled women and reinforce the movement for self-help; urges UN bodies and other organizations to continue efforts to elaborate sufficient and adequate indicators on women in development; calls on Member States and organizations of the UN system to increase the participation of women in professional and decision-making positions (adopted without vote, 15th meeting, 24 May 1989).

[E/RES/]1989/38 (E/1989/INF/7) Elderly women.

Recommends that concerted efforts be undertaken or strengthened in order to enable women to meet the challenges they face during their lives, particularly in their older years; recommends that information be provided to bodies responsible for the advancement of women to enable them to undertake a precise and in-depth analysis of the situation of elderly women and if necessary, develop new methods for data collection; requests the Secretary-General to organize a seminar to study questions arising from this analysis and to transmit the results of the study to the Commission on the Status of Women; encourages Governments to ensure that women increase their participation in social and economic progress throughout their lives; urges Governments, in co-operation with non-governmental organizations concerned, to strengthen activities for the benefit of elderly women, taking better account of their specific needs; requests the Commission on the Status of Women, in carrying out its review and appraisal of the implementation of the Nairobi Forward-looking Strategies for the Advancement of Women, to devote particular attention to the current and future situation of elderly women throughout the world (adopted without vote, 15th meeting, 24 May 1989).

[E/RES/]1989/39 (E/1989/INF/7) Women, human rights and development in Central America.

Urges Governments, UN bodies and non-governmental organizations to support: (a) programmes to strengthen women's organizations that are demanding that women be granted their full rights as citizens; (b) activities to broaden and deepen discussion of the problems of Central American women and solutions thereto; (c) research to analyse the problems of Central American women in all their dimensions and to propose alternative solutions based on the opinions of all the women's sectors concerned; (d) publications and information and documentation systems on the results of the proposals for integration or practical action that will permit women's organizations in the Central American region to advance within the general context of society; urges women's associations to develop education, training and self-help programmes aimed at improving the living conditions and the social and political participation of Central American women (adopted without vote, 15th meeting, 24 May 1989).

WOMEN'S ADVANCEMENT (AGENDA ITEM 10B) (cont.)

[E/RES/]1989/40 (E/1989/INF/7) Women living in absolute poverty.
Requests the Secretary-General to take into account, in the report prepared in accordance with General Assembly resolution 43/195, the impact of absolute poverty on women; draws the attention of the Commission for Social Development to the need to discuss in depth, at its 32nd and subsequent sessions, the subject of absolute poverty and women, when considering reports of the Secretary-General concerning the world social situation; urges the Commission on the Status of Women to give due consideration to the subject of absolute poverty when considering its priority themes of equality, development and peace; appeals to all Member States to make efforts to overcome absolute poverty by increasing the level of integration of women in the social and economic development of their countries (adopted without vote, 15th meeting, 24 May 1989).

[E/RES/]1989/41 (E/1989/INF/7) Women and development.
Requests the Secretary-General, in collaboration with the regional commissions, to include in the report to be submitted to the Commission on the Status of Women at its 34th session an evaluation of the effects of the debt crisis, including the effects of the structural adjustment programmes, on the implementation of the Nairobi Forward-looking Strategies for the Advancement of Women; requests the organizations of the UN system concerned with development, when designing their relevant programmes, to pay special attention to the role of women, especially rural women and poor women, in the development process, particularly in the fields of education, health, employment, agriculture and social services; requests the organizations of the UN system to maintain and strengthen their institutional support structures for women in developing countries (adopted 40-0-13, 15th meeting, 24 May 1989).

[E/RES/]1989/42 (E/1989/INF/7) Economic situation of women in Latin America and the Caribbean.
