INTRODUCTION

The Security Council is the organ of the United Nations which has primary responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security under the Charter of the United Nations. The Council, which is composed of 15 members, is organized so as to be able to function continuously.

The Index to Proceedings of the Security Council is a guide to the documentation and proceedings of the Security Council, and of its commissions, committees and ad hoc committees. The present issue covers the forty-sixth year (1991) of the Security Council and its five subsidiary bodies which met during the year. The Index is prepared by the Dag Hammarskjöld Library as one of the products of the United Nations Bibliographic Information System (UNBIS).

ARRANGEMENT OF THE INDEX

The **Index** consists of the following parts:

Sessional information, listing members and officers, and providing information on rules of procedure and on resolutions and decisions:

Check-list of meetings, listing the meetings of the Council and those of its subsidiary bodies that met during the year;

Agenda, listing matters considered by and brought before the Council together with the subject headings under which these items are listed in the subject index;

Subject index, providing topical access to Security Council documentation arranged alphabetically by subjects and listing documents submitted to the Council, the meetings at which items were considered and the action taken, if any:

Index to speeches, providing access to speeches that were made before the Security Council. The index is subdivided into three sections: corporate names/countries, speakers and subjects;

List of documents, listing documents arranged by symbol;

Resolutions adopted by the Security Council, 1991, listing resolution numbers and titles, the subjects under which they may be found in the subject index,

as well as the meetings and dates on which the resolutions were adopted;

Voting chart, indicating the voting for resolutions adopted by the Council.

DOCUMENTATION OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

Documents of the Security Council are first issued in provisional form. A selected number of them are subsequently printed in the quarterly Supplements to the they are Official Records, where arranged Some special reports are issued chronologically. individually as numbered Special Supplements. Resolutions adopted by the Security Council, first issued in provisional form, are later collected along with decisions taken, in a separate volume of the Official Records of the year. After their republication in the Official Records, the provisional documents are no longer available.

Double-symbol documents bearing both S/- and A/symbols were submitted to both the Security Council and the General Assembly.

Verbatim records of meetings of the Security Council appear first in provisional form. They may be identified by their symbol, which consists of the series corresponding to that of the meeting, e.g., S/PV.2979. Verbatim records of meetings are later printed as separate fascicles in the Official Records.

S/RES/686 (1991) [Conditions for the cessation of offensive combat operations in the Persian Gulf region].

Affirms that all 12 resolutions continue to have full force and effect; demands that Iraq implement its acceptance of all 12 resolutions and in particular that Iraq: (a) rescind immediately its actions purporting to annex Kuwait: (b) accept in principle its liability under international law for any loss, damage, or injury arising in regard to Kuwait and third States, and their nationals and corporations, as a result of the invasion and illegal occupation of Kuwait; (c) immediately release under the auspices of the International Committee of the Red Cross, all Kuwaiti and third-country nationals detained by Iraq and return the remains of any deceased detainees; (d) immediately begin to return all Kuwaiti property seized by Irag, to be completed in the shortest possible period; further demands that Iraq: (a) cease hostile or provocative actions by its forces against all Member States, including missile attacks and flights of combat aircraft; (b) designate military commanders to meet with counterparts from the forces of Kuwait and the Member States cooperating with Kuwait pursuant to resolution 678 (1990) to arrange for the military aspects of a cessation of hostilities; (c) arrange for immediate access to and release of all prisoners of war (d) provide all information and assistance in identifying Iraqi mines, booby traps and other explosives as well as any chemical and biological weapons and material in Kuwait, in areas of Iraq where forces of Member States cooperating with Kuwait pursuant to resolution 678 (1990) are present temporarily, and in the adjacent waters (adopted 11-1-3, 2978th meeting, 2 Mar. 1991).

S/RES/687 (1991) [Conditions for a formal cease-fire in the Persian Gulf region].

Calls upon the Secretary-General to help Iraq and Kuwait demarcate the boundary between them; requests the Secretary-General to submit a plan for the deployment of a UN observer unit to monitor the Khor Abdullah and a demilitarized zone; decides that Iraq shall accept the destruction of all its chemical and biological weapons and of its ballistic missiles with a range greater than 150 kilometres; reaffirms that Iraq is liable for any direct loss, damage, or injury to foreign Governments, nationals and corporations resulting from the occupation of Kuwait; decides that Iraqi statements repudiating its foreign debt are null and void; decides to establish a fund to pay compensation for claims; decides that Iraq is liable under international law for any direct loss, damage, including environmental damage and the depletion of natural resources, or injury to foreign Governments, nationals and corporations, as a result of Iraq's unlawful invasion and occupation of Kuwait; decides that all Iraqi statements made since 2 Aug. 1990 repudiating its foreign debt are null and void; decides that the sale of foodstuffs and supplies for essential civilian needs shall not be prohibited; decides to prohibit the sale of arms related materiel to Iraq; decides that Iraq shall facilitate the repatriation of foreign nationals; requires Iraq to inform the UN that it will not support terrorism (adopted 12-1-2, 2981st meeting, 3 Apr. 1991).

Expresses its full support for the collective efforts for peace and dialogue in Yugoslavia undertaken under the auspices of the member States of the European Community with the support of the States participating in the Conference on Security and Cooperation in Europe consistent with the principles of that Conference; invites to this end the Secretary-General to offer his assistance without delay, in consultation with the Government of Yugoslavia and all those promoting the efforts referred to above, and to report as soon as possible to the Security Council; strongly urges all parties to abide strictly by the cease-fire agreements of 17 Sept. 1991 and 22 Sept. 1991; decides, under Chapter VII of the Charter of UN, that all States shall immediately implement a general and complete embargo on all deliveries of weapons and military equipment to Yugoslavia until the Security Council decides otherwise following consultation between the Secretary-General and the Government of Yugoslavia (adopted unanimously, 3009th meeting, 25 Sept. 1991).

Yugoslavia].

Approves the efforts of the Secretary-General and his Personal Envoy and expresses the hope that they will pursue their contacts with the Yugoslav parties, as rapidly as possible, so that the Secretary-General can present early recommendations to the Security Council including for the possible establishment of a UN peace-keeping operation in Yugoslavia; endorses the statement made by the Personal Envoy of the Secretary-General to the parties that the deployment of a UN peace-keeping operation cannot be envisaged without, inter alia, full compliance by all parties with the agreement signed in Geneva on 23 Nov. 1991 and annexed to the letter of the Secretary-General (S/23239); strongly urges the Yugoslav parties to comply fully with that agreement; undertakes to examine and take appropriate action without delay upon the recommendations of the Secretary-General mentioned above, including in particular any recommendation for the possible establishment of a UN peace-keeping operation in Yugoslavia (adopted unanimously, 3018th meeting, 27 Nov. 1991).

S/RES/724 (1991) [Implementation of Security Council resolution 713 (1991) on an embargo on deliveries of weapons and military equipment to Yugosiavia].

Endorses in particular the views expressed in paragraph 21 of the Secretary-General's report that the conditions for establishing a peace-keeping operation in Yugoslavia still do not exist and in paragraph 24 that full compliance with the Geneva Agreemet of 23 Nov. 1991 would permit accelerated consideration of the question of establishing a UN peace-keeping operation in Yugoslavia; acting under Chapter VII of the UN Charter: (a) requests all States to report to the Secretary-General within 20 days on the measures they have instituted from meeting the obligations set out in paragraph 6 of resolution 713 (1991); (b) decides to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council: (i) to examine the reports submitted pursuant to subparagraph (a) above; (ii) to seek from all States further information regarding the action taken by them concerning the effective implementation of the embargo; (iii) to consider any information brought to its attention by States concerning violations of the embargo; (iv) to recommend appropriate measures in response to violations of the embargo; encourages the Secretary-General to pursue his humanitarian efforts in Yugoslavia, in liaison with the International Committee of the Red Cross, the UN High Comissioner for Refugees, UNICEF and other appropriate humanitarian organizations (adopted without vote, 3023rd meeting, 15 Dec. 1991).
