




The event will be moderated by Mr. Ben Dotsei Malor, United Nations



Ben Dotsei Malor is currently the Chief Editor of Dailies, <u>United Nations</u> <u>News</u> under the Department of Global Communications in New York. His expertise, experience and accomplishments span the fields of international broadcasting, journalism, media and public information, speechwriting, as well strategic communications, digital-social media, from his extensive work across the United Nations, and also at the BBC World Service in London, where he was a well-known presenter and Editor.

In his home country of Ghana, Malor served as Presidential Spokesperson and Director of Communications for former President John Mahama. In Liberia he served as the Spokesperson and Chief Public Information Officer (a.i.) for the UN Mission in Liberia, and in Pakistan as the UN Humanitarian Spokesperson, right after the earthquake of October 2005. Before joining the United Nations, Malor worked for more than 12 years with the BBC World Service in London, where he became the Deputy Editor of one of the BBC's flagship news and current affairs radio programmes, Focus on Africa.





Ally Yusuf Mugenzi has been the Editor of the <u>BBC Great Lakes Section</u> since September 2005. He is responsible for the editorial output of this section which broadcasts to the Great Lakes region which covers Rwanda, Burundi, Eastern Congo, some parts of Western Tanzania and Western Uganda.

Mugenzi started reporting for Focus on Africa and Swahili Services of the BBC World Service after the first attack of the Rwandan Patriotic Front in October 1990. In 1994 he was appointed to join the team in London as a producer. Shortly after his arrival in London, the genocide in Rwanda took place. Mugenzi played a key role in setting up the BBC Gahuzamiryango (Family Unifier) Lifeline Project established after the genocide. In 1997 Mugenzi was transferred to Gahuzamiryango as a producer and then a Senior Producer.
