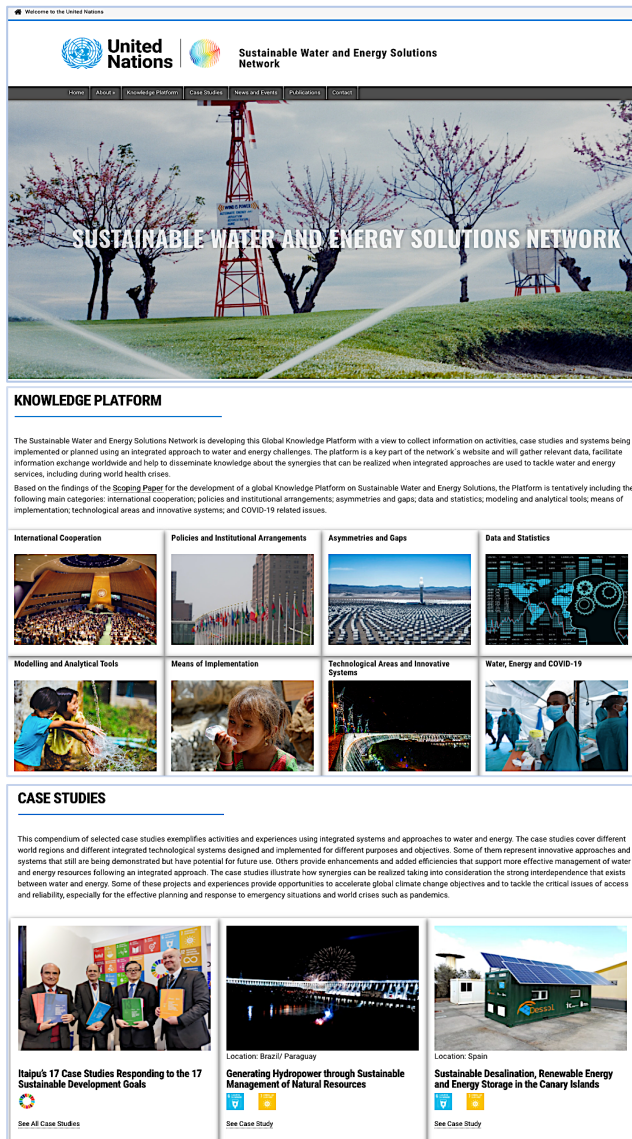

The Sustainable Water and Energy Solutions Network

Recognizing the need to address the interlinkages between water and energy and their contributions to the advancement of other SDGs, the UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN DESA) and ITAIPU Binacional joined efforts in 2018 in partnership entitled "Sustainable Water and Energy Solutions" to promote water and energy sustainability and other SDGs. The initiative resulted in the creation of the global **Sustainable Water and Energy Solutions Network** on SDG 6 and SDG 7 interlinkages, with a large number of multi-stakeholders from all regions and constituencies. The aim is to bring together all stakeholders to promote an integrated approach to SDG 6 and SDG 7 in support of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
