

# Future-forward Development Planning in Asia and the Pacific: a UN DESA Global Policy Dialogue

Join UN DESA and UN ESCAP for a hybrid stock-take and discussion of the current economic outlook for Asia and the Pacific, using new data from the *World Economic Situation and Prospects* (WESP) report launched in January 2024. In-person experts from both organizations and other stakeholders from the region will consider the challenges that the current outlook presents to the delivery of the SDGs, in particular related to SDG 1, No Poverty, and offer suggestions for sound policies to ensure the well-being of people in Asia and the Pacific. A focus will be on highlighting solutions that will help developing countries in the region limit their risk to emerging vulnerabilities, including ways to address shortages in SDG funding and strengthen capacities to improve sustainable development now that will pay off in later years.

The information provided in the WESP report serves as a valuable guide to countries in their sustainable development planning. As growth decelerations and uncertainty can cause suffering on multiple levels, UN DESA and ESCAP will use this session to help countries prioritize economic and social policies that reduce inequalities and protect the planet. This event will provide countries with data and ideas to better prepare for the future.

#### **Format**

The event will run for 75 minutes and will be hybrid in format, with an in-person moderator and inperson speakers, with a mixed in-person and online audience (live on Zoom and DESA's YouTube channel).

The discussions will be interactive and led by the moderator. Time will be reserved during the event for audience questions and polls. The audience will also be invited to submit questions in advance when completing the Zoom registration.

This event will be part of the long-running UN DESA Global Policy Dialogue Series, which has been offering monthly online discussions on the SDGs since launching in 2020 and has a passionate, built-in virtual audience. UN DESA is prepared to hire a video producer to make this event look professional for the online audience.
