

A Regenerative Blue Economy as Means to Harmonizing Climate Action: a post-2030 framework beyond sustainability

CONTEXT

Today, we find ourselves in need of more than just sustainability; we require regeneration.

The future of our coastal and marine environments is precariously perched on the edge of an ecological disaster, with biodiversity rapidly vanishing and ecosystem services dwindling. This ongoing tragedy necessitates an immediate and decisive response. The Blue Economy, traditionally seen as a sustainable path for economic growth through the responsible use of marine resources, is no longer sufficient given the pressing threats our oceans face: overfishing, pollution, climate change, inadequate governance, and limited financial resources. In light of these challenges, the concept of a "regenerative blue economy" has emerged, prioritizing both sustainability and economic prosperity while actively seeking to protect and rejuvenate our marine and coastal ecosystems. This approach extends beyond maintaining the status quo, aiming to breathe new life into our natural oceanic resources, empower local communities, bringing together public and private sector, and recognize the interconnectedness of the sea and climate.

To transition from sustainability to regeneration, we propose the utilization of key analytical tools and a collaborative approach grounded in robust scientific methodologies. Specifically, we advocate for a life cycle-based framework that defines Regenerative Contribution Units (RCUs), enabling contributions towards the global goal of achieving net-zero emissions and expediting innovative proof of concept initiatives that offer actionable insights for a nature-positive future.

To bring this vision to fruition, we have fostered a comprehensive collaboration among all stakeholders, including governments, industrial clusters, local communities, NGOs, and even tourists. Each participant has a crucial role to play in transforming our approach to marine conservation and socioeconomic growth, departing from the business-as-usual mindset, and embracing an approach that emphasizes conservation, regeneration, and resilience.





Our proposal encompasses an accompanying event that will not only give voice to influential ocean advocates, facilitating a discussion on the vision beyond 2030 and the necessary steps to establish a cohesive framework, guiding principles, and appropriate tools, but also spotlight the pioneers of a groundbreaking pilot project where the private sector serves as a catalyst for a new paradigm of development.

During the Side Event, the launch of the Regenerative Standard eCO2care will be announced together with a Call for Regenerative Projects for the 2025 UN Ocean Conference.
