Voices for Change: A Climate Justice Anthem Launch"

Launch of a Traditional Climate Justice Song for Pastoralist Communities

Objective:

To launch a powerful, traditional song that amplifies the voices of pastoralist communities, urging for compensation and recognition for the losses and damages they have endured due to the climate crisis. The song will be used as both a cultural and advocacy tool to raise awareness about the impacts of climate change on pastoralists, and to call for urgent action, support, and compensation from policymakers, governments, and international bodies.

Background:

Pastoralist communities, who depend on livestock farming and mobility for their livelihoods, have faced increasing hardship due to the impacts of climate change. Changing weather patterns, prolonged droughts, and erratic rainfall have led to reduced grazing lands, water scarcity, and loss of livestock. These communities are among the most vulnerable yet least compensated for the damages they incur. The traditional song that will be launched at this event is a call for climate justice—a fusion of culture, music, and advocacy that gives voice to the injustices experienced by pastoralists.
