





- User-friendly metadata creation, encouraging Findable, Accessible, Interoperable and Reusable (FAIR) research outputs.






Figshare on Africa for Africa

- non-African researchers working on African topics


Figshare provides equitable pricing, using the same country categories (A&B) as the Research4Life programme, as set by the World Bank









