WHY: With the world facing multiple global crises and limited resources, it is more important

than ever to seek solutions that synergistically address the climate emergency and sustainable development at the same time, to accelerate action on all fronts. All evidence shows that GHG emissions are still rising, impacts are becoming more severe, and time is

running out to make a course correction and limit warming to 1.5 degrees C. The most

recent Sustainable Development Goals Report states that an "urgent rescue effort" is needed for the Goals (SDGs), and that "years or even decades of development progress have been halted or reversed" as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and other global crises. This conference aims to strengthen action on both climate and SDGs by promoting integrated win-win solutions for both challenges.
