Concept notes for the interactive dialogues are now available

In accordance with the General Assembly resolution on the modalities for the 2022 UN Ocean Conference (A/RES/73/292), the Conference will feature eight interactive dialogues that will be collaborative and multi-stakeholder in nature and that will focus on recommendations to support the implementation of Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 14, including through strengthened cooperation, existing successful partnerships and stimulating innovative and concrete new ones, taking into account the theme of the Conference "Scaling up Ocean Action Based on Science and Innovation for the Implementation of Goal 14: Stocktaking, Partnerships and Solutions".

The deadline for eligible stakeholder organizations to register participants for the 2022 UN Ocean Conference will be **on Friday, 3 June 2022**. Relevant stakeholders, including non-governmental organizations, civil society organizations, academic institutions, the scientific community, the private sector and philanthropic organizations, whose work is relevant to the 2022 UN Ocean Conference, accredited in accordance with the provisions set forth in <u>Annex II of A/RES/73/292</u> can pre-register up to **five representatives** to participate as observers in the Conference. Sustainable Blue Economy Investment Forum

The Sustainable Blue Economy Investment Forum (SBEIF), to be held on Tuesday, **28 June**, in **Cascais**, will launch a process for designing sustainable blue economies global standard, to be used in financial instruments, investment decisions and business. In addition, the SBEIF will be an opportunity to establish a common language for a sustainable ocean economy and to explore how to build synergies between integrated Ocean Management Plans, trade finance, marketing and distribution value chains and the private sector. High-Level Symposium on Water – Bridging SDG 6 and SDG 14

The High-Level Symposium on Water, to be held on Monday, **27 June**, in **Lisbon**, is one of the preparatory meetings for the UN 2023 Water Conference that will explore the interlinkages between SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation) and SDG 14 (Life below Water). This event will provide an opportunity to strengthen the role of water and ocean in the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Paris Agreement and will offer a platform for presenting successful best practices and partnerships. Ocean Voluntary Commitments

In its resolution 73/292, the UN General Assembly called for new voluntary commitments to be made in support of SDG 14, in connection with the 2022 UN Ocean Conference.
