

THE ACTION AGENDA ON INTERNAL DISPLACEMENT - HIGHLIGHTS

Since the Secretary General launched his Action Agenda on Internal Displacement in June 2022, twenty-two UN agencies have begun work to advance the 31 commitments made in the Action Agenda towards the inter-linked goals of prevention, response and solutions to internal displacement.

Highlights of some of the concrete deliverables anticipated under the Action Agenda by the end of 2024 include:

10M

10 million internally displaced persons placed on solutions pathways across up to 15 solutions-pilot countries.



A government-led, development-financed, inter-agency supported, **solutions model** developed, built from lessons-learned from 15 pilot countries and beyond, and with participation of affected people at its core.



Time-bound **Solutions Advisers** embedded in Resident Coordinators Offices to accelerate UN solutions efforts, supported by a new, dedicated, UNDP-administered UN Solutions Advisers Facility created for this purpose.



A new **financing facility** launched to support solutions-focused programming by UN Country Teams, with the goal to support up to 40 countries with a total USD 100 million over 5 years.



Individual (Entity) and collective (Inter-Agency) reforms to policies and practices leading to greater system-wide coherence and collaboration across the humanitarian, development and peacebuilding spectrum.



Following a review of humanitarian responses to internal displacement being undertaken by the Inter-Agency Standing Committee in 2023, **innovations in early humanitarian responses** to displacement.



A **new protection risk assessment tool** to support solutions efforts and transitions from humanitarian protection mechanisms.



A global framework for **improved coordination for data** on solutions to internal displacement.



Improved **access to development financing** for internal displacement solutions.



A new **UN-sponsored framework to assess urban displacement**, aimed at supporting local authorities.
