



Intergovernmental Consultations on the Preparatory Process of the Summit of the Future

Tentative Timetable for Roadmap (as of March 30)

February – September 2023

This revised roadmap focuses on meetings that the co-facilitators for the intergovernmental consultations on the preparatory process of the Summit of the Future plan to organize in the run-up to the Ministerial Meeting, currently scheduled for 18 September 2023. Our informal consultations are oriented towards the "Our Common Agenda" <u>Policy Briefs</u> that are issued by the Secretary-General over the first half of 2023 to support Member States in their deliberations as they prepare for the Summit of the Future. Additional rounds of consultations will focus on the overall scope of the Summit and on the recommendations by the High Level Advisory Board on Effective Multilateralism.

As co-facilitators, we aim to ensure that there is sufficient time for Member States to absorb the proposals in each Policy Brief before an informal consultation is scheduled. Please note that meetings and consultations arranged by other co-facilitators of mandated processes related to the Summit of the Future are not reflected in this roadmap. We are doing our utmost to coordinate the dates for our consultations with other mandated processes and high-level events of the 77th session of the General Assembly.
