The activities of the SDG7 Youth Constituency have a global scope with particular focus on outreach to underrepresented and marginalised youth groups in developing countries. Currently, the SDG7 YC engages with more than 200 youth-led and youth-serving organisations. In line with the actions outlined in the Compact, the goal is to expand the involvement of youth in policy advocacy and capacity building activities to at least 20,000 youth annually and to expand outreach with funding and other opportunities to at least 100 new youth-led organisations per year.
