## **Brief description of the event**

The recently held UN Summit of the Future's preamble clearly outlines the need to recognise children and youth as agents of change and the need for intergenerational dialogue and engagement, including with and among children, youth, and older persons, to be considered in our policy and decision-making processes to safeguard the needs and interests of future generations.

To contribute to this global ambition. We propose an inter-generational dialogue on 21<sup>st</sup> November at the SDG pavilion with children and youth from various countries including Zambia, Somalia, Malawi, Rwanda, Pakistan and Sierra Leone. This intergenerational panel discussion will explore the crucial role of children and youth in driving sustainable development and addressing global challenges. By bringing together young people and experienced professionals from various fields, the event aims to foster intergenerational dialogue, inspire innovative solutions, and highlight the potential of young people-led initiatives to contribute to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in the face of climate change.

- 2. Address Challenges and Opportunities: To identify and discuss the challenges young people face in implementing sustainable projects, particularly in the context of climate change, and explore ways to strengthen partnerships with them.
- 3. **Empower Youth-Led Change:** To inspire and empower young people to become active agents of change, fostering a movement towards a more sustainable and equitable world.
