The Foundation for the Voluntary Team for Humanitarian Work, which monitors the Paris Agreement on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and is a member of the Civil Society Committee of the World Health Organization, proposes some proposals that should be included in the future charter, which are:



First: Adding the clause "Justice for a Shared Future" by exempting all developing countries from paying debts, provided that the major countries of the G20 bear the repayment of these funds, in exchange for the colonial era, which was the reason for the growth of those countries and also a reason for the backwardness of the Third World countries.

Second: Ensuring that funding is not leaked to governments, associations, and intermediaries. This was happening now, as most of the funding is exposed to a lot of corruption.

Third: Compensation for losses and damages shall be for the people, from a friend of the United Nations, to oblige the countries that caused the launch Greenhouse gases are required to pay for the global carbon response, and these funds are directed to support small projects for people in third world countries to achieve development for these people.

Fourth: True representation of civil society in international decision-making in United Nations organizations in all bodies. Civil society representation must not be less than 30%, as the status of observer or consultant is considered not to involve civil society in decision-making, as

civil society is the one who implements these decisions. How can someone impose a decision on him?

Fifth: The funding structure of the United Nations, its agency, or programs must be directed to the deserving poor in the form of projects. Small things that help them live and lead to combating poverty and thus achieving sustainable development goals.
