Chapeau

WWF suggestions for concrete, and action-oriented language for the Chapeau:

- a. "We commit to work towards a nature-positive future, which means that we, as a global society, halt and reverse the loss of biodiversity and put nature measurably on the path to recovery by 2030."
- b. "We commit to substantially increase efforts to effectively address the adverse impacts of climate change, biodiversity loss, pollution and desertification through accelerated and integrated efforts across all sectors of the economy and all parts of society, towards the achievement of targets and goals set out in the three Rio-Conventions, including the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework and the Paris Agreement, as well as the swift ratification of the BBNJ agreement."
- c. "We reaffirm our commitment to secure a net-zero and nature positive future by limiting global warming to 1.5°C to minimise climate-related losses to people and nature, and by halting and reversing biodiversity loss by 2030."
- d. "We commit to transition to just and sustainable patterns of production and consumption and sustainable food systems that meet people's needs while remaining within planetary boundaries."

Chapter I. Sustainable development and financing for development

WWF suggestions for concrete, and action-oriented language for Chapter I:

- e. "We call for the accelerated implementation of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework and its targets, which set out an ambitious plan to halt and reverse biodiversity loss by 2030, in line with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals.
- f. "We commit to continue to deliver and report on all SDG targets, including those nature-related targets that expired in 2020."
- g. "We call on all Parties that have not done so yet to update their National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plans (NBSAPs) or set ambitious national biodiversity targets aligned with the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework as soon as possible, and through a participatory process to foster ownership by the whole of society."

- h. “We commit to fully deliver the Addis Ababa Action Agenda on financing for development as a key framework for the provision of the means of implementation for the achievement of sustainable development.”
- i. “We commit to fully implement the finance related targets of the Paris Accord and the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, including the repurposing of harmful incentives.”
- j. “We commit to ensure all development finance is climate sensitive and environmentally sound, recognizing that environmental degradation, climate change and biodiversity loss exacerbates poverty worldwide”.

WWF suggestions for concrete, and action-oriented language for the Chapter IV:

- k. “We emphasise that children and youth are not only a major focus of the Pact, but also are afforded meaningful engagement and access to decision-making processes.”
- l. “We establish a standing UN Youth Town Hall which will, as a first point of order, establish a global standard for meaningful youth engagement.”
- m. “We commit to think and act in the interests of Future Generations, including through the elaboration of a Declaration on Future Generations and the installation of a Special Envoy for Future Generations.”

Chapter V. Transforming global governance

WWF suggestions for concrete, and action-oriented language for Chapter V:

- n. “We reaffirm our commitment to effectively address the planetary crises and to enable sustainable development through a whole-of-society, whole-of-government and rights-based approach”
- o. “We commit to promote, protect and fulfil the human right to a clean, healthy and sustainable environment”.
- p. “We confirm our political commitment to develop a framework to measure progress that goes beyond gross domestic product and is anchored in the 2030 Agenda.”
