

UN-Energy Meeting (Technical Level)

14 February - 08:30 to 09:30 EST (NY Time)

Virtual meeting

Meeting Summary

UN-Energy member and partner organizations met virtually at the technical level on 14 February 2023, 08:30 to 09:30 EST. The agenda and the list of participants are attached as Annex 1 and Annex 2.

- 1. UN-Energy Priorities for 2023 and Information-sharing by UN-Energy Members on opportunities for cooperation
- The Secretariat provided a presentation on the priorities for UN-Energy for 2023, including an overview of the relevant UN processes and meetings which provide the context for this work. Moreover, a number of deliverables were suggested in the areas of policy analysis, new partnerships, Energy Compacts, Global SDG7 Action Forum, communication, and Greening the Blue. A revised version of the presentation which incorporates the suggestions made during the meeting is annexed (ANNEX 3).
- The presentation was followed by an open discussion in which the following key points were raised:
 - Members supported the suggested deliverables and highlighted their contributions to achieving them.
 - It was noted that there should be a focus on implementation, particularly considering the goal of 500 million newly connected people by 2025.
 - Many members signalled their interests to engage in analyses on clean cooking; just, inclusive and equitable transition; and levels of energy access. It was suggested that brainstorming sessions on these topics could be organized by the Secretariat to bring together interested parties. It was pointed out that energy efficiency should not be forgotten in these discussions.
 - The importance of the interlinkages between energy and climate was flagged, especially considering their prospective role at COP28 and the Climate Ambition Summit.
 - Several interventions highlighted upcoming consultations on energy at the regional level which would contribute to informing the review of SGD7 at the HLPF.
 - Various expressions in submitting proposals for High Impact Initiatives in the context of the SDG Summit were made.
 - The new Multi-Partner Trust Fund (MPTF) on Decarbonising Humanitarian Energy (DHE) supported by UNITAR, UNDP and NORCAP, with funding support from the German Government provides a concrete opportunity for broader cooperation.

Closing

The Secretariat thanked all participants for their valuable contributions and noted that members may share additional information also in writing after the meeting. As part of the next steps, the Secretariat will initiate the suggested brainstorming sessions including to establish working groups which could be extended to additional multi-stakeholders.

We are at the mid-point of 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development




The ongoing war in Ukraine triggered multiple crises,
