Overview

The Pre-Summit event will serve as the preparatory meeting for the UN Food Systems Summit in September by consolidating all the substantive work of the Summit into a common vision and setting a tone of bold ambition and commitment to action. Given the richness of ideas coming through the Summit's workstreams and self-organizing constituency groups over the past year, the main program sessions will serve to surface their key content and enable the exchange and engagement across all stakeholders.

Affiliated sessions will serve a key complementary role in bringing out additional valuable ideas and offering a platform to convene actors around the world to ensure more voices and ideas are heard, and more actors are thinking about how to take action in their own contexts.

The official Pre-Summit programme will run each day, and there are three time blocks for parallel affiliated sessions in the morning, mid-day, and evening to avoid any overlap with the main sessions. See the below programme that outlines days and time blocks.
