United Nations Global Risks Perception Survey

Background

Major global shocks in recent years have highlighted the need for the multilateral system to manage risks better. The Global Risks Perception Survey is being carried out by the United Nations with the support of the Lloyd's Register Foundation Institute for the Public Understanding of Risk at the National University of Singapore to gather information on stakeholders' perceptions of global risks and their views on the multilateral system's capacity to manage those risks. The survey results will inform the UN Global Risks Report which will be launched before the Summit of the Future in September 2024.

Scope

While the UN does not define or endorse any single definition of "global risk", for the purposes of this survey, a global risk can be understood as <u>an uncertain event or condition that would have a significant negative</u> impact on a large portion of humanity and ecosystems.

Selection of Risks

The survey features 28 of global risks. Their definitions are accessible throughout the survey by hovering over each risk (or tapping on mobile devices). This set of risks was selected through an extensive process of review and consultation by the UN. It is not intended to be comprehensive. However, you will be given an opportunity at the end of the survey to propose other global risks which you think are important.

You have been identified by the UN as someone with professional experience in risk through academic and professional networks.

This survey aims to assess perception of the likelihood, impact, and interaction among the top global risks and their projected impact among governments, academia, private sector and civil society (including youth, women) across five continents.

The survey asks for some information about you such as your nationality and age. This will be used to analyze the demographic distribution of survey respondents. You will not be asked to provide your name or any other personal identifiers. All information provided will be regarded as confidential.
