## **UN 2.0 Implementation Kickstart Guide for RCs**

A non-exhaustive list of practical steps you can take to advance the implementation of UN 2.0 with your teams.

Driver	#	Action
STRATEGY & RESOURCES		Leverage the "Pact for the Future" mandate (Action 45, Paragraph. 73.a) to advocate for shifts in current or future strategies, programmes, budgets, and posts that enhance capabilities in data, innovation, digital, foresight, and behavioural science expertise for accelerated SDG progress.
		Start a conversation with the UN Country Team on how UN Sustainable Development Cooperation Frameworks (UNSDCF) can translate stronger capabilities in data analytics, digital tools, innovation methodologies, foresight planning, and behavioural science into better Member State support.
		Organize workshops with UNCT teams to brainstorm how data, digital technologies, innovation, foresight, and behavioural science can enhance mandate delivery and their country programmes - both by streamlining internal operations and introducing new ways to fulfill mandates.
		Advocate for support from pooled funding instruments (SDG Joint, PBF, CBPF, CERF, etc.) for projects that prioritize data, digital, innovation, foresight, and behavioural science approaches.
		Utilize existing ICT and telecommunications budgets to acquire software licenses and tools, for example spend \$2.5 per month per RCO staff to get the Microsoft Teams Premium Add-On for easy meeting transcript summaries and identify follow-on tasks for action items in meetings you convene.
		Review the UN 2.0 Use Case Portfolio for inspiration from other UN teams on how to apply UN 2.0 approaches for better impact.
		Run a survey within your country team to assess existing capabilities (e.g., skill levels in data, digital, innovation, foresight, behavioural science) and organizational culture (e.g., openness, partnerships, risk-taking, bottom-up initiatives) to identify strengths and opportunities for growth.
CULTURE & CULTUR		Establish incentives that promote grassroots innovation by recognizing colleagues who bring new ideas or innovative solutions (e.g., public recognition, professional development opportunities, rewards like travel or specialized training).
		Integrate UN 2.0 goals and performance targets into annual performance documents for your staff to align individual objectives with organizational priorities.
		Provide accessible learning opportunities to leaders and managers through brownbag presentations, dialogue series, or workshops with external experts.
		Share success stories publicly to inspire broader adoption and attract potential collaboration partners.
		Encourage your team to implement digital approaches to optimize daily workflows, e.g. Microsoft Forms instead of paper forms.
		Include UN 2.0 elements - such as cultural guidelines and learning resources - in onboarding materials for new managers and team members.

PEOPLE & LEARNING	- 🔲	Advocate with AFPs to hire more experts in UN 2.0 or data-related roles. Refer to the UN 2.0 LinkedIn channel for weekly examples of specialist job posts from across the UN system.
		Incorporate UN 2.0 experience requirements into all job postings in RC Offices to attract candidates with relevant skills (contact dos-hr-advice@un.org for guidance).
		Hire researchers as consultants to embed specialized 'fellowship' expertise into your teams or facilitate research projects.
		Leverage United Nations Volunteer (UNV) postings to fill gaps in UN 2.0 areas, especially for specialized projects.
		Encourage all colleagues to join UN 2.0 communities of practice for peer learning and knowledge exchange by signing up at <u>un-two-zero.network/join-us</u> .
		Encourage colleagues to pursue new learning opportunities, such as the free UN 2.0 Fundamentals e-Learning Path offered by UNSSC, or online courses available through LinkedIn Learning, HBS Online, Coursera, and edX.
		Inform and encourage teams to make use of training and upskilling opportunities, such as the free UN 2.0 Fundamentals e-Learning Path offered by UNSSC, or online courses available through LinkedIn Learning, HBS Online, Coursera, and edX.
COLLABORATION & PARTNERSHIPS		Establish collaborations with universities by initiating joint projects where the UNCT members provide problem sets and universities develop solutions, or by offering fellowships (via consultancies) for UN 2.0 projects. For example, email <a href="mailto:fiona.cece@un.org">fiona.cece@un.org</a> for info about the UN MOU with ETH Zurich, one of the world's top-10 universities and top-5 lead in computer science, or the IE University collaboration, among others.
		Convene roundtables on UN 2.0 related topics with government and partners, e.g. 'Digital Futures in Health', 'How to build innovation ecosystems'.
		Invite external speakers from universities, civil society organizations, and other sectors to enhance understanding of data, innovation, digital technologies, foresight, and behavioural science across your teams.
Quant land		Facilitate regular knowledge-sharing sessions with UN entities, academic institutions, civil society, and the private sector to promote collaboration and shared learning.
