

INTRODUCTION




Principal UN Organs and the Human Rights Council adopted over 40,000 resolutions, decisions, and presidential statements since 1946.





A complex set of UN System entities has been created over the past 80 years to deliver on these mandates.




UN SYSTEM CHART Full version, March 2025 *


Today, over 140 entities work across the wider UN System in service of Member States and their populations.




Across all pillars, UN System entities delivered about \$69 billion in support and services in 2023.

The UN System is a global platform that links humanity to shared goals and impacts hundreds of millions of lives on the ground.





In 2025, we expect resources across the UN System to shrink by up to 30% compared to 2023 – back to levels last seen 10 years ago.





Without action, we risk losing our ability to serve those who need us most – with at least 30 million and potentially nearly 60 million lives impacted.








UPDATES ON WORKSTREAM 2 MANDATE IMPLEMENTATION REVIEW



Our initial focus has been on the mandates for the >100 departments, offices, peace operations, and other entities in the UN Secretariat.






Most of the >3,900 cited documents are from the body of resolutions passed since 1946 – and most of them date from the last 10 years.




The mandate documents are the basis of UN Secretariat resource requests, totaling about \$15B in 2023 – and representing 20% of the UN System total.






Over 40% of mandates originate from the GA – any changes in mandates will require joint work through the relevant intergovernmental organs.

Some UN entities cite a much larger number of mandate documents than others – and 50% of all citations are explained by only 5 entities.




