

# Statement by Ambassador Norberto Moretti, Deputy Permanent Representative of Brazil to the United Nations 80<sup>th</sup> session of the General Assembly UN80 Initiative – Workstream 2

## 14 November 2025, ECOSOC CHAMBER (Limite de tempo: 3 minutos)

#### Co-Chairs,

I thank you for convening this meeting on the "mandate implementation", component of Workstream 2 of the UN80 Initiative.

Brazil associates itself with the statement delivered by Iraq on behalf of the Group of 77 and China.

#### Co-Chairs,

Efficient evaluation costs less than new mandates. A sound, responsive and timely evaluation mechanism within the mandate implementation network can help save valuable financial and human resources, while

preventing Member States from generating duplicate or overlapping initiatives.

We must refine — and, where appropriate, create — new review tools. These tools should connect the scanning phase during mandate creation to the evaluation of existing mandates, ensuring a coherent, integrated and holistic approach to mandate implementation.

We should also strengthen the evaluation of the mandate implementation network by equipping it with the necessary financial and human resources, in line with best practices across the UN system. Investing in the improvement of our evaluation capacities can yield significant savings and increase the Organization's ability to deliver on its mandates effectively.

Let us work toward a **common framework** for the evaluation of mandate implementation — one that objectively measures the achievement of mandates

through transparent, reliable and unbiased criteria. Such a framework should provide actionable input to guide budgetary and administrative decision-making processes.

Digital innovation can play an important role in this effort. Dynamic and interactive virtual dashboards on mandate implementation, accessible to Member States and supported by artificial intelligence tools and timely feedback mechanisms, could greatly enhance transparency and accountability.

### Co-Chairs,

A robust and credible system for evaluating the mandate implementation network is not a technical exercise alone — it is a strategic investment in the efficiency, coherence and legitimacy of the United Nations itself. Strengthening this evaluation process will enable us to allocate resources more wisely, prevent

redundancies, and ensure that the Organization remains 4.

fit to deliver on the priorities set by Member States.
