




Only 19 per cent, or approximately US\$ 64,682 of the US\$ 329 million appealed through the 2017 UNRWA Syria Regional Crisis Emergency Appeal, has been funded. The Agency continues to be in dire need of essential contributions to meet the basic needs of Palestine refugees remaining in Syria.


Sector requirements 2017 (US\$)

Cash assistance

According to a verification exercise conducted at the end of 2016, 438,000 Palestine refugees remain in Syria. Out of those, 418,000 individuals, or 95 per cent, rely on humanitarian assistance, including cash, food and non-food items, to survive and 254,000 were displaced at least once within the country.


