WHAT IS A MOBILE HEALTH CLINIC?

- The mobile health clinics serve communities in Area C, H2 and seam zones that have no access to primary healthcare services.
- The mobile health clinics include a doctor, nurse and midwife. They provide primary health care services for a community and also provide curative treatment and some laboratory tests on a daily basis.
- The clinic is registered and licensed to practice by the MOH.
- The clinic visits each community at least 4 times per month.
- There is an established referral mechanism with basic rehabilitation care providers.

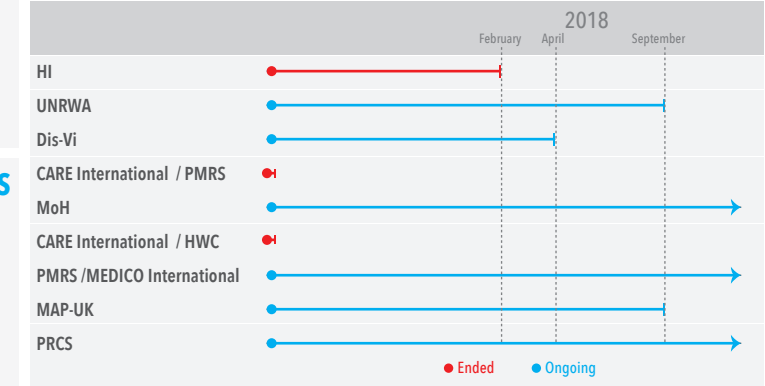

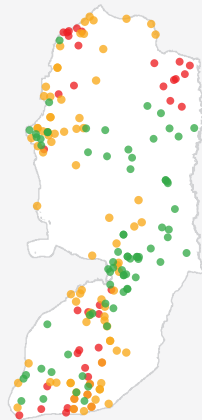

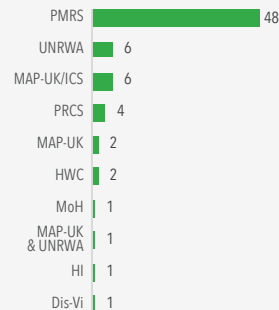
THE IMPACT OF FUNDING ON MOBILE HEALTH CLINICS



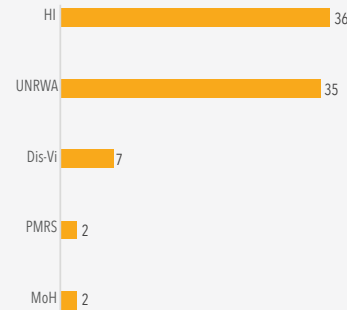
MOBILE CLINIC BY STATUS, PARTNER AND LOCATION



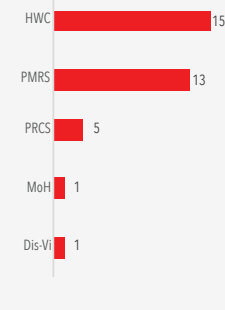
