
# Syria: UNRWA - Humanitarian Snapshot, April 2018



## Escalation of military operations in Yarmouk and surroundings, and displacement of residents

April witnessed the launch of military operations against non-state armed groups in Yarmouk, Yalda, Babila, Beit Sahem (YBB), and Hajar al Aswad. The ongoing hostilities in Yarmouk and Hajar al Aswad have caused deaths and injuries and have displaced up to six thousand Palestine refugees from Yarmouk into the neighbouring area of Yalda, taking refuge in makeshift shelters. UNRWA has not been able to access YBB since May 2016; the Agency estimates that out of the 65,000 civilians still residing in Southern Damascus, there are up to 12,000 Palestine refugees who are in dire need of protection and humanitarian assistance.



#### FOOD, NON-FOOD ITEMS (NFI) & SHELTER:

UNRWA distributed 71,643 food parcels to 168,758 Palestine refugees through regular distribution. In addition, food parcels were provided to 84 Palestine refugee families displaced from Eastern Ghouta. 2,124 individuals received non-food items. Number of residents in collective IDP shelters run by UNRWA decreased to 1,455 as of end of April.

No regular round of cash distribution took place in April; however emergengy cash stipend was provided to 84 families recently displaced from Eastern Ghouta.

### **EDUCATION:**

A risk assessment for 18 schools located in Damascus and Rural Damascus (with a total of 8,928 students) was conducted to evaluate the security and safety risks and corresponding mitigation measures, including evacuation plans.

A total of 68,632 health consultations were provided to Palestine refugee patients at the 26 UNRWA health facilities across Syria. 10,364 vaccinations were administered at UNRWA clinics and health points in April.

### LIVELIHOODS (MICROFINANCE & TVET):

459 students (331 females and 128 males) graduated from short term vocational courses, and 33 students (10 females and 23 males) completed courses on employability skills. 895 loans (332 females and 563 males) were provided benefiting up to 3,043 Palestine refugees and Syrians.

## WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH):

UNRWA provided Palestine refugees with 13,108 items of WASH assistance (including 535 hygiene kits, 10,327 diapers, 1,415 sanitary napkins, 540 baby kits, and 150 packs of liquid and powdered detergent).
