The Agency 'Meets' or 'Exceeds' for 44 per cent of performance requirements as compared to the 57 per cent average in the UN.

High-Level Conference on Progress Made in the Implementation of Beijing after Twenty-Five Years: On the occasion of the 25th anniversary of the adoption of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (UN-ESCWA), the UN Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN Women), the League of Arab States, and the Arab Women Organization will be holding a "High-Level Conference on Progress Made in the Implementation of Beijing after Twenty-Five Years", on 28 November 2019 at the United Nations House in Beirut, Lebanon. A final document will be adopted at the end of conference, reaffirming the principles enshrined in the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action and setting the priorities for action areas for the future. This document will be submitted on the 64th session to the United Nations Commission to reflect the Arab position on the Beijing Review 25 years later. Read more here.
