### Bio Notes of Panellists

**Maha Abdallah** is an international advocacy officer at the Cairo Institute for Human Rights Studies and formerly a senior legal researcher at Al-Haq, focusing on business and human rights and corporate accountability in occupied territory and conflict-affected settings; primarily the role of corporations in the unlawful exploitation of natural resources, complicity and involvement in human rights abuses. She was elected to the ESCR-Net (International Network for Economic, Social and Cultural Rights) Board in 2018 and serves on the Project Advisory Group of ESCR-Net’s Corporate Capture Project and on the Conflict and ESCR Advisory Group. She received her LL.M. from the Irish Centre for Human Rights and B.A in Political Science from The American University in Cairo.

**Hagit Ofran** works at the “Settlement Watch” project at the Israeli peace movement of “Peace Now”. Widely recognized as one of Israel’s foremost experts on a full range of issues related to West Bank settlements and settlement-related developments in East Jerusalem, Hagit’s work includes traveling daily throughout the West Bank, examining aerial photos and browsing official Israeli documents. The “Settlement Watch” project serves as a resource for Israeli politicians, diplomats, international media organizations, and first and foremost – for the Israeli public. She is one of “66 Israeli women you should know” of Haaretz daily: “Women breaking barriers, defying stereotypes and wielding influence”. She lives in Jerusalem and received her B.A. in Jewish History from Hebrew University.

**Osamah Khalil** is a historian and Associate Professor of US foreign relations and the modern Middle East at Syracuse University's Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs. He is the author of “America’s Dream Palace: Middle East Expertise and the Rise of the National Security State” (2016) and the editor of “United States Foreign Relations with China and Iran: Toward the Asian Century” (2019). He is currently writing a book on the history of the Palestinian national movement. Khalil has been a frequent media commentator and contributor, including for the *Huffington Post*, *Los Angeles Times*, *The Hill*, *Al Akhbar*, and *Al Jazeera*.
