


Shelter Cluster 2020 Dashboard COVID-19 Response Plan

This Dashboard presents information on the shelter activates related to Covid-19 pandemic, and responses provided by Shelter Cluster members in the West Bank (Area C, East Jerusalem) and Gaza .Since March until December 2020 more than 100,000 individuals have been reached with adequate covid-19 shelter support in both WB and Gaza


Jerusalem and WB

Gaps, challenges and constraints

A main constraint is the lack of quality household disaggregated information on needs to accurately target interventions compounded by the movement restrictions that impede access to the most vulnerable households and communities.

The lack of accurate information about the prioritized poor families at home quarantine impede the cluster ability to provide required NFI and hygiene materials, in addition many of Bedouin and herding communities suffer from overcrowding conditions with limited partner capacities to provide quick and adequate solutions to reduce the impact of the pandemic on the family members.
