#### Sahar Dahche

Sahar Dahche is a Palestinian refugee from Lebanon who lives in Ein El-Helweh camp in south Lebanon. She graduated from Siblin Training Centre (STC) in 2017 with a diploma in Architectural Engineering, and was able to explore her talent in graphic design in the STC Culture and Media Club. After graduation, she decided to pursue her passion in graphic design at the Lebanese university. She worked as a freelancer in graphic design during that time, to cover the costs of attending university.

In 2018, Sahar started her journey with the then-newly established UNRWA Innovation Labs, and participated in workshops on digital skills, life skills, and social entrepreneurship. During the Entrepreneurship course, Sahar introduced her business idea - designing and printing services – and moved it to the incubation stage. Her project was awarded a seed grant of US\$ 2,000, which ultimately helped her start her own business. During that time, Sahar was also provided with business coaching and mentoring, and she built many connections on both a personal and professional level.

Today, Sahar is interning with UNRWA and supported by UNICEF's GIL project. She is the graphic designer responsible for designing social media posts for the UNRWA Innovation

The Youth Unit in Lebanon runs various initiatives, including Labs to highlight youth success stories and achievements. "Although I was not expecting such a career path, which I do not regret, but I'm very grateful to what I already achieved".
