Update: Escalation of hostilities - Gaza May 2021

Between 10 and 20 May 2021, the Gaza Strip witnessed another significant hostility in which many buildings were destroyed and thousands of people were internally displaced. According to the information verified by Shelter Cluster based on figures from MoPWH, MoSD, UNRWA and other cluster partners at height of the conflict over 117000 individuals were fled their homes due to the intensive air strikes and the destruction of the houses including 77,000 were seeking safe places at UNRWA schools and the remaining were at host community and informal shelters

Additionally, the Israeli air strikes in Gaza left 1,019 destroyed housing units and 706 housing units have severely damaged and approximately 25,600

housing units with different levels of damage. This dashboard summarizes the needs, responses and gaps in shelter





Urgent needs

- TSCA and Reintegration Cash
- Around 1,500 families in need of TSCA aequivalent to six months rental supported and Reintegration Cash assistance
- Repair
- 706 HU with severe damage to reduce the IDPs caseload
- 25,622 HU with partial damage to maintain living conditions to minimum standards.
- Provision of NFIs and dignity kits to displaced people and who have partially damaged homes
- Medium and long term needs
- Reconstruction of 1,019 HU that have been totally destroyed
