

**Statement Issued by the Co-operative Republic of Guyana on the
Occasion of the United Nations International Day of Solidarity with the
Palestinian People**

November 29, 2021

Guyana joins the international community in observing the United Nations International Day of Solidarity with the Palestinian People and reaffirms its unwavering support for the realization of the inalienable rights of the Palestinian people.

The Government and people of Guyana firmly believe in the right of every person to a dignified existence in their own homeland and stand in solidarity with the people of Palestine in their legitimate aspirations, including the right to self-determination and freedom.

As a member of the United Nations and of its Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People, Guyana remains firm in its conviction that justice and respect for the rule of law and human rights are indispensable bases for lasting peace in the Middle East.

Against the backdrop of the COVID-19 pandemic and considering the already dire humanitarian, economic and development situation in the Occupied Palestinian Territory, Guyana implores the international community to collectively and individually intensify efforts to address protection gaps for Palestinian refugees and to mobilize the resources needed to alleviate the suffering of the Palestinian people.

Guyana also laments the persistent deadlock in the Middle East peace process and is deeply concerned about the impact that this impasse has in fueling tension and instability in the region. We urge all parties to recommit to constructive negotiations, in good faith, and based on the long-established and agreed parameters for a two-State solution.

The Government of Guyana continues to hold firm in its belief that constructive dialogue between Israeli and Palestinian authorities is the only viable solution by which the goal of lasting peace could be achieved.

Guyana stands ready to lend its support to these efforts and will continue to promote the cause of peace and justice in the Middle East, so that all peoples in the region may live within secure borders and be allowed to enjoy fully the fruits of peace and development.
