

AD HOC COMMITTEE ON THE PALESTINIAN QUESTION

DRAFT RESOLUTION ON ACTS OF VIOLENCE

PROPOSAL SUBMITTED BY THE DELEGATION OF COLOMBIA

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

CONSIDERING that notwithstanding the appeal addressed to the peoples of Palestine by means of Resolution 107 of the Special Session, acts of violence are frequently committed in Palestine and threats of violence continue to be made in that country and elsewhere; and

BEARING IN MIND Recommendation XI made unanimously by the United Nations Special Committee on Palestine,

RESOLVES to call again upon the peoples of Palestine to extend their fullest co-operation to the United Nations in its effort to devise and put into effect an equitable and workable means of settling the difficult situation prevailing there, and to this end, in the interest of peace, good order, and lawfulness, to exert every effort to bring to an early end the acts of violence which have for too long beset that country.
