WHO RESPONSE

WHO oPt's response includes delivery of **medicine and medical supplies** to Al-Makassed Hospital and the Palestine Red Crescent Society (PRCS), for the immediate **treatment of trauma victims** and to **replenish medical stocks** to ensure preparedness and response for future needs



Rapid needs assessment conducted with Al-Makassed and PRCS



\$158,000 Utilised by WHO to procure emergency medical supplies



\$1,000,000 Pipeline value of equipment and emergency medical supplies under procurement



11,000 People suffering from trauma and injuries can be treated through WHO-provided supplies



44 health workers trained on mass casualty management (MCM). Since January 2022, WHO has trained 148 health workers on MCM

- Monitor and document attacks against health care
