Sir,

I have the honour, at the request of the United Nations Special Committee on Palestine, to ask you to be good enough to transmit to your Government its invitation to present to the Committee, in such manner as may be found appropriate, the views of your Government on the question of Palestine.

Similar invitations have been addressed to the other Arab states.

It is the view of the Committee that if it should be the desire of your Government to present oral testimony on the question, this should be done at the same time and place as may be mutually convenient to the spokesmen of the participating Governments and the Committee in one of the neighboring Arab states prior to the Committee's departure for Geneva, or at Geneva after its arrival there.
