


### **UN Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People**

1. Bureau condemns the raid by Israel Forces inside the Aqsa Mosque Compound



On 5 April, the Bureau issued a statement following the intrusion and violence against Palestinian worshippers at the Aqsa Mosque Compound in Jerusalem.

2. Bureau meets with Minister of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates of the State of Palestine



On 24 April, the Bureau met with Minister of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates of the State of Palestine, H.E. Mr. Riyad Al-Maliki. Bureau members reiterated their commitment to supporting the peaceful resolution of the Question of Palestine and expressed a consensus about not overshadowing the Palestinian plight with other global crises. The discussion further expressed support for the Secretary-General's increased engagement on the question of Palestine as well as for the State of Palestine's full UN membership and the revival of the Middle East Peace Process.

## 3. The Committee Chair addresses the quarterly Security Council Open Debate on the situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question



On 25 April, Ambassador Cheikh Niang, the CEIRPP Chair and Permanent Representative of Senegal, delivered the Committee's statement to the quarterly Security Council Open Debate on the situation in the Middle East including the Palestinian question. At the ministerial-level meeting attended by H.E. Mr. Riyad Al-Maliki, Minister of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates of the State of Palestine, the Chair conveyed concern at Israel's advancement of settlements,

condemned violence in Jerusalem, reiterated the need to uphold the historic status quo of the Holy Sites, and appealed for Security Council leadership to protect the Palestinian people.

## 4. New Permanent Representative of Malaysia becomes Committee Vice Chair and Rapporteur



On 3 May, the Committee elected Permanent Representative of Malaysia, H.E. Mr. Ahmad Faisal Muhamad, as Committee Vice-Chair and Rapporteur. At the meeting, in addition to providing an update on development in the Occupied Palestinian Territory (OPT), the Permanent Observer of the State of Palestine, H.E. Mr. Riyad Mansour, briefed on the guidelines and procedures for Member States to submit statements to the International Court of Justice (ICJ).



#### 5. CEIRPP holds closed consultations with Civil Society on Gaza



On 27 April, the Committee held closed consultations with Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) to discuss the situation in Gaza. The virtual meeting, titled "The ongoing Nakba in Gaza: blockade, dispossession, and denial of rights," was conducted under the Chatham House Rule, with CSO representatives from Palestine, Israel, and the United States alongside Committee members and observers. The meeting focused on the Great March of Return and its legacy, the violation of the right of return for Palestine refugees, Israel's restrictions on family reunification, and access of Palestinians in Gaza to healthcare.

On 9 May, the Bureau organized a lunch meeting, hosted by Indonesia, with the ten non-permanent members of the Security Council (E10). The roundtable discussed how to collectively bring a political horizon to the Palestinian plight, including through efforts towards a resumption of peace negotiations between Israel and the State of Palestine. Permanent Observer Riyad Mansour provided a political update, including on Israeli airstrikes in Gaza, and urged the E10 to identify sustainable solutions to the conflict.

7. Committee Commemorates 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Nakba with a High-Level meeting followed by a Special event in the General Assembly Hall



On 15 May, for the first time, the UN commemorated the 75th anniversary of the Nakba, pursuant to a General Assembly Resolution mandate. The Chair of CEIRPP presided a high-level event, which included a keynote address by H.E. Mr. Mahmoud Abbas, President of the State of Palestine, as well as interventions by Ms. Rosemary DiCarlo, UN Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs, Mr. Nyle Fort, Associate Professor of African Studies at Columbia University, speaking as CSO representative, and a video message from Mr. Philippe Lazzarini, UNRWA's Commissioner-General and other interventions by representatives of Regional Groups.



In the evening on the same day, a Special Commemorative Event was held in the General Assembly Hall. A video message by Csaba Kőrösi, President of the General Assembly was followed by a performance by Palestinian composer, Naseem Alatrash and the New York Arabic Orchestra, accompanied by Palestinian singer Sanaa Moussa. The event brought to life the Palestinian experience of the Nakba through live music, photos, videos, and personal testimonies.

#### 8. Bureau members meet with Palestinian civil society representatives



On 22 May, members of the Bureau met with representatives of Palestinian civil society organizations and the Israel-Palestine Working Group based in New York. Civil society representatives updated on the situation in the Occupied Palestinian Territory (OPT) and on recent reports concluding that Palestinians in the OPT are victims of a situation of apartheid. They also called to restore the UN Special Committee on Apartheid.

#### 9. Bureau members meeting with UNRWA Commissioner-General



On 30 May, the Committee Bureau met with UNRWA Commissioner-General Philippe Lazzarini to discuss the current financial status of UNRWA before the General Assembly-convened Pledging Conference on 2 June 2023. The Commissioner-General raised alarm about the Agency's deepening funding crisis while Ambassador Cheikh Niang, Committee Chair, reaffirmed support for adequate funding and leveraging UNRWA's 75 anniversary to galvanize international backing.
