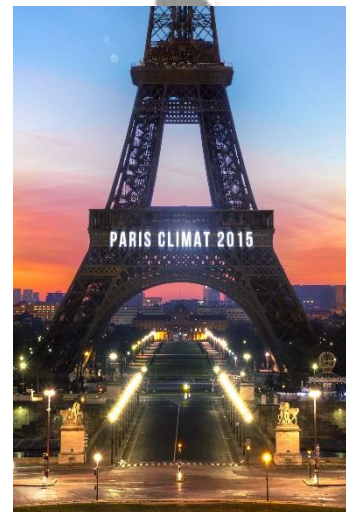
The *Paris Climate Agreement* (2015) is the global policy framework for climate responses in the coming decades. This event will provide an overview of this keystone agreement, examining the main provisions as they concern the rights and development agenda of indigenous peoples.

It will focus on the climate-forest interface, looking at the growing number of international, bilateral, national and local efforts to address deforestation and advance sustainable forest management under the provisions for REDD+.

The event aims at engaging leaders, representatives and partners of indigenous peoples in a pragmatic analysis of the provisions and implementation modalities of this new global climate framework, to help scoping opportunities to promote their rights and development priorities.
